1. Chair Rozar called the meeting to order at 4:00 PM and declared a quorum present.

- 2. Under public comment, Public Health Manager Kathy Alft noted that the Health Department was recognized for 25 years in the Healthy Smiles/Seal a Smile program, the only one in the state with this many years of service put into this program.
- 3. The consent agenda was reviewed with inquiries being addressed. Errors in the previous minutes, including date and location, were noted. Motion by Buttke/Thao to approve the consent agenda with the minutes corrected as noted. Motion carried unanimously.
- 4. Health Department Director Smith and Alft reviewed the 2026 Health Department budgets and noted the changes made due to federal funding being cut. There are still unknowns but the budget presented is a best guess at this point in time. Motion by Buttke/Kronstedt to approve the 2026 Health Department budgets as presented and forward to the Finance Department. Motion carried unanimously.
- 5. Norwood Administrator Kornack reviewed the current status of the Norwood water management noting that design work continues with plan design meeting coming up before going to the bid process.
- 6. Edgewater Haven Administrator Cieslewicz reported that the insurance company has once again denied the claim on the generator conduit line cleaning. The project is out to bid at present.
- 7. Edgewater Haven Administrator Cieslewicz, Norwood Administrator Kornack, and Human Services Director Vruwink presented the 2026 Human Services budgets. There were decreases in levy support for Edgewater Haven and Norwood, and a small increase, within the parameters set by the Operations Committee, for the Community portion of the Human Services budgets. The department heads

discussed the various challenges moving forward, such as a decrease in federal funding and the unknown direction of the ADRC for the meals program. Motion by Buttke/Kronstedt to approve the 2026 Human Services budgets as presented and forward to the Finance Department. Motion carried unanimously.

- 8. Veterans Service Officer Larson presented the 2026 Veterans budgets. He reviewed the request of the Veterans Service Commission for an increase in the Veterans Relief budget and explained its uses. Motion by Thao/Valenstein to approve the 2026 Veterans budgets as presented and forward to the Finance Department. Motion carried unanimously.
- 9. Motion by Hokamp/Thao to go into closed session pursuant to 19.85(1)(f) Wis. Stats to consider leave of absence requests. Motion carried unanimously.
- 10. Motion by Buttke/Kronstedt to return to open session. Motion carried unanimously.
- 11. The next meeting will be held on Thursday, September 25th at 5:00 PM at the Edgewater Haven Nursing Home Conference Room.
- 12. Chair Rozar declared the meeting adjourned at 6:31 PM.

ADMINISTATIVE REPORT - SUE SMITH, RN, MSN, CPM

- I would like to extend my deepest sympathy to Supervisor Hokamp for the loss of his mom, Marion. Marion served on the Wood County Board for many years and was a member of the Board of Health for many years as well. She was a wonderful lady and a joy to work alongside.
- Safe Haven Baby Box: The city attorney has been working on a contract with the SHBB organization. There seem to be a few hiccups. I attended the Finance Committee meeting, and they did direct legal counsel to enter into a contract with the SHBB organization, so it appears it is moving forward. Linda Casper and I met with Sue Schill, the city attorney, to talk through ways we can support the city as this moves forward. We will begin fundraising soon and are seeking out an organization to serve as a fiscal agent and hold the funds, pay expenses, etc. Linda Casper and I were interviewed by James for a WFHR Rapids Report (thank you to Supervisor Penzkover for setting that up). - **Opioid Settlement:** The current balance remains at \$374,336.43. We are working on scheduling a meeting of the Opioid Task Force to make some tweaks to our grantmaking process and then put out a request for applications. We plan to present the task force recommendations for funding to HHSC in November and Operations and the County Board at their December meetings.

Legislative Update:

- There have been some confusing changes to **regulations of electronic vaping devices**. There is a state law (WI Statute 995.15) as well as federal regulations that were recently implemented that outlaw many vaping devices. Our local coalition is working on gathering clear information and I will share that when it is available. At the present time, local retailers are confused about specifics, and many are clearing out any devices that are clearly not allowed under the new regs. The Department of Revenue (DOR) is the enforcement agency for this law, and they have been communicating to retailers the requirements of this policy.
 - This is the definition of an electronic vaping device: "Electronic vaping device" means a device that may be used to deliver any aerosolized or vaporized liquid or other substance for inhalation, regardless of whether the liquid or other substance contains nicotine, including an e-cigarette, e-cigar, e-pipe, vape pen, or e-hookah. "Electronic vaping device" includes a component, part, or accessory of the device, and includes a liquid or other substance that may be aerosolized or vaporized by such device, regardless of whether the liquid or other substance contains nicotine. "Electronic vaping device" does not include a battery or battery charger when sold separately.
 - Only products listed on the Electronic Vaping Device Directory are allowed in WI. The directory is created, maintained, and enforced by DOR. The policy was passed in 2023 through Act 73 and went into effect July 1, 2025. An update for electronic vaping devices that contain hemp was passed on July 3rd, 2025, through Act 15 (state budget). All electronic vaping devices must be listed on this directory to be sold in Wisconsin. However, appearance on the directory does not indicate a device complies with all applicable state, local, and federal laws.
 - Requirements of manufacturers of electronic vaping devices:
 - o Electronic vaping devices that are not hemp devices: By July 1, 2025, manufacturers of electronic vaping devices must submit a list of all products available for sale in Wisconsin and provide proof that these products have either (1) received marketing authorization order from the FDA; or (2) the device was marketed as of August 8, 2016 and they've submitted a Premarket Tobacco Product Application (PMTA) to the FDA and the application is still under review or a final decision on the application has not taken effect. Starting September 1, 2025, manufacturers and retailers will be fined \$1,000 per day for each device that is being offered or sold that is not listed on the directory.
 - o Electronic vaping devices that only contain hemp: Act 15 included changes to 995.15 related to requirements for hemp devices. DOR will be updating their publication document to reflect those changes. By July 1, 2026, manufacturers of electronic vaping devices that contain hemp and not nicotine must submit a list of all products available for sale in Wisconsin and provide a certificate of analysis from an independent laboratory showing that the electronic vaping device is a hemp device and does not contain nicotine. Starting September 1, 2026, manufacturers and retailers will be fined \$1,000 per day for each device that is being offered or sold that is not listed on the directory.
 - o Devices must be certified through DOR each year with a \$500 fee per device.
 - o The directory will be listed on DOR's Cigarette, Tobacco, and Vapor Products webpage and is available here: DOR Electronic Vaping Device Directory.
 - Electronic vaping device directories are being challenged around the country. A lawsuit was recently filed in Wisconsin. At this time, we don't know how this will impact the implementation and enforcement of the directory.
- We are also keeping an eye on the **Assembly Bill and Senate Bill 192, which establishes fatality review teams under state law.** The bills require the WI Department of Health Services (DHS) to develop a fatality review program and authorizes, but does not require, DHS to create state fatality review teams. The bill requires DHS to perform

various duties, in consultation with other state agencies as appropriate, such as: 1) facilitate local team development; 2) identify training needs and make available training resources; 3) provide technical assistance and support; 4) in the absence of a local team or upon request, assign review of deaths to a state fatality review team, if established; 5) educate the public on causes and recommendations for prevention of reviewable deaths; and 6) provide information to the legislature, state agencies, and local communities on the need for modifications to law, policy, or practice.

- The bill identifies examples of the types of deaths that may constitute a reviewable death, including overdose, suicide, maternal death occurring during or within a year of a pregnancy, or any unexpected or unintentional death of a child, among others.
- Under the bill, a fatality review team has the purpose of gathering information about reviewable deaths to examine risk factors and understand how deaths may be prevented, through identifying recommendations for cross-sector, system-level policy and practice changes, and promoting cooperation and coordination among the agencies involved in understanding causes of reviewable deaths or in providing services to surviving family members.
- The bill authorizes a fatality review team to access records from a variety of sources, such as certain state agencies, law enforcement, medical examiners and coroners, health care providers, social or human service agencies, schools, and the prescription drug monitoring program, among others, subject to certain restrictions under the bill and current law.
- Information and records provided to or created by a fatality review team are confidential, subject to limited exceptions provided under the bill, and are not subject to Wisconsin's public records laws.
- The bill also exempts fatality review team meetings from Wisconsin's open meetings law.
- Finally, we are tracking **AB** and **SB** 211 The Tobacco Bar Bill. As you might have heard, the <u>Tobacco Bar Bill</u> was on the floor for a vote in the Assembly on September 11. At first glance, some lawmakers think this bill simply creates a narrow exception for adults-only cigar bars. The reality is very different. Here is a summary: *This bill exempts* tobacco bars from the general prohibition under current law against smoking in indoor locations if the tobacco bar satisfies all of the following: 1) the tobacco bar came into existence on or after June 4, 2009; 2) only the smoking of cigars and pipes is allowed in the tobacco bar; and 3) the tobacco bar is not a retail food establishment. Current law defines a "tobacco bar" as a tavern that generates 15 percent or more of its annual gross income from the sale on the tavern premises, other than from a vending machine, of cigars and pipe tobacco. Also, under current law, tobacco bars that existed on June 3, 2009, are exempt from the general prohibition against smoking in indoor locations.
 - This legislation creates a significant loophole in Wisconsin's 15-year strong, extremely popular smoke-free air law.
 - It does not grant local control, meaning communities cannot limit or regulate so-called "tobacco bars."
- It risks increased secondhand smoke exposure in public places.
- It puts service workers back in unsafe conditions.
- It introduces confusion into what has been a clear, effective law that has protected health for years.
- Here is more educational information from the Partnership for Tobacco Free Wisconsin.

SUPERVISOR OF STRATEGIC INITIATIVES REPORT - KRISTIE RAUTER EGGE. MPH

- Staff conducted an employee input survey to assess employee satisfaction, well-being, and workplace culture and refined a process for staff to create individual development plans for workforce development purposes.
- Staff updated employee orientation checklist and are working on an internal Strategic Planning workgroup.
- Staff are serving as a mentor for a group of 3 residents in the N2PH (New to Public Health) residency program.

Communication/Branding

- Staff continue to attend and provide support to the Wisconsin Department of Health Services Communications Strategy Workgroup meetings. Staff, met with the Leadership Team to plan the Statewide Public Health Public Information Officer Network meeting.
- Staff provided updates for the HPWC website and facilitated an internal WCHD Communications Committee meeting.
- Handouts for Healthy People Wood County have been created for staff and partners to utilize to help communicate and share information, current Community Health Improvement initiatives, efforts, and details about the Advisory Council.
- Staff published new pages to the Healthy People Wood County website. Visit healthypeoplewoodcounty.org to explore information, initiatives, and support aimed at enhancing community health.

Community Health Improvement Plan Work

- The Healthy People Wood County Advisory Council convened in September. This meeting included a partner presentation on 2-1-1 data and updates on the Community Health Improvement Plan and other initiatives.
- Dissemination and implementation of the Improvement Plan is ongoing through a variety of channels, including actively
 engaging with elected officials, conducting outreach to municipalities and villages, facilitating group discussions, holding
 one-on-one meetings, and sharing at community events. We invite partners and organizations interested in learning
 more about the action plan or exploring potential collaboration opportunities to connect with us to schedule a meeting or
 presentation.
- Staff meetings are currently ongoing to review and update the 2025-2027 Community Health Improvement Monitoring and Evaluation plan, ensuring it reflects current efforts and resources.
- Ongoing meetings and engagement with partner health systems are taking place to align efforts and outline future collaborative initiatives.
- Staff are serving as a preceptor for a UW-Madison DNP student who will be working on the access to care CHIP priority.

Mental Health

- Meetings with partners and organizations are being held to align efforts, foster collaboration, and provide support.
- Activities outlined in the action plan are being implemented to address the use of technology and social media on youth mental health, social isolation, and loneliness, and the impact of adverse childhood experiences (ACEs).
- Staff participated in the MACY Mental Health Task Force Meeting. The task force is actively engaged in strategic
 planning and identifying the needs of Marshfield youth to develop strategies and initiatives to impactfully move forward
 with.
- Staff attended the Prevent Suicide Wisconsin Coalition meeting to learn about the Wisconsin Suicide Prevention Plan, strategies, best practices, resources, and recommended actions for suicide prevention.
- Throughout September, we recognized Suicide Prevention Awareness Month by creating awareness social media posts and writing an article for the Pittsville Record.
- Staff attended the Commit to Connect Annual National Summit to Increase Social Connections. This summit brings together local, state, and national leaders from across sectors to address social isolation.

Financial Security

Staff met with partners to discuss incorporating financial security into employee wellness programs and orientation processes.

Farmer's Market

On Saturday, August 16, a severe weather event struck the downtown farmer's market, causing significant damage. Despite closely monitoring weather advisories, the storm arrived more quickly and with greater intensity than expected. As a result, many vendors experienced losses to both product and equipment. Still, the month of August brought many positives. We welcomed 69 vendors and several local businesses, filing the market with fresh food, handmade goods, and the warm presence of our community. Here a quick look at the impact for August:

- \$1,112 in Debit/Credit transactions
- \$984 in SNAP/EBT transactions
- \$240 in SNAP/EBT Double Dollar Match benefits
- \$220 in Aspirus Fruit and Veggies RX redemptions
- \$59,927 in total vendor sales

USDA Regional Farmers Market Collaboration

- Staff organized and hosted our Central WI Farmers Market Collaborative bimonthly virtual meeting with guests from Manitowoc County to share information about the efforts to reduce food waste and donate healthy food to pantries from farmers markets (gleaning).
- Staff entered and collected data for our Farm2Fact portal, hosted a treasurer training for the Waupaca Farmers Market, attended partner meetings with: PartnersHP, Wisconsin Nutrition Initiative (WINI), created updated marketing materials for Farmers Market of Wausau: A Frame sign & banner, were awarded \$6,000 in grant funds to assist Wood County Farmers Markets through the CEED committee, and completed a Farmers Market Information Booth Process Document for the Stevens Point Farmers Market in conjunction with Graduate students.

Safe Kids Wood and Clark Counties

- Staff completed Department of Transportation (DOT)/car seat reporting. Staff held a child death review meeting and entered the case information into our case reporting system.
- A mock drunk driving car crash will be held on October 1 at Pittsville for their homecoming week. A helicopter will be flying in. Robin (another coordinator of Safe Kids- took Liz's spot) with Marshfield Clinic has been planning this event.
- Staff completed training via webinars focused on teen driving as we are trying to target that with homecomings coming up and school starting.

Housing

Staff researched housing strategies to support people who are homeless. A connection was made with a business owner in the community who wants to support this work.

Substance Use

- LifePoint Program: LifePoint is a satellite syringe service program of Vivent Health in which participants receive
 resources, overdose reversal medication, and sterile supplies needed to reduce their risk of injury and harm while using
 substances. Most participants of the program are living with a substance use disorder and share about the struggles they
 face every day. There were two program participants in August who additionally helped nine others with supplies and
 resources from the program.
- Marshfield Area Coalition for Youth (MACY): The MACY Drug Task Force continued strategic planning in August to
 complete the working action plan for Year 2 of the Drug Free Communities (DFC) Support program for northern Wood
 County (Marshfield, Hewitt, Arpin, and Auburndale). The plan focuses on upstream youth prevention of alcohol, nicotine,
 and THC use. The Drug Task Force also had a display booth at the Central Wisconsin State Fair in Marshfield, which
 was an opportunity to educate people about what MACY is and the work the group does.

- Overdose Fatality Review (OFR) Team: The Wood County OFR Team met for the first time in August to talk through
 individual fatality cases that will shed light on ways the community can prevent future fatalities. Partners from across the
 county met to discuss a case from multiple perspectives including responding agencies, case investigators, and any
 other agencies who may have interreacted with the decedent. A unique element of OFR cases is Next of Kin interviews
 to help the team understand the decedent's life story. This group will determine how future meetings will be structured,
 as the first meeting was paired with the Child Death Review Team.
- HOPE Consortium Conference: The substance use team participated in the 9th Annual HOPE Consortium Virtual Conference August 7 and 8. The conference brought together various professionals in substance use-related fields for a two-day learning and networking opportunity focused on prevention, treatment, recovery, and risk reduction. The conference also offered five tracks on Ethics & Boundaries, Specific Substances, Professional Skills & Development, Community Engagement, and Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome. Pamela Lee, Community Health Worker with WCHD, presented on Wood County's six public health vending machines with co-presenters sharing about machines located in Portage, Taylor, and Jackson counties.
- Northwoods Coalition (NWC):
 - NWC held a four-part virtual Opioid Academy that concluded with an in-person legislative breakfast on August 20. Wood County was invited to present a success story on our Opioid Settlement process where several community coalitions from northwestern Wisconsin were in attendance. Ashley Normington (Public Health Strategist, WCHD) and Elizabeth Walter (Executive Director, Three Bridges Recovery) shared information from the Opioid Task Force. Wisconsin Department of Health Services Director of Substance Use Initiatives, Michelle Haese, also presented, providing an overview of the opioid landscape in Wisconsin. Langlade County reached out following the presentation, as they would like to replicate a similar process to what Wood County has in place.
- NWC held a virtual member meeting in August with a presentation from the Wisconsin DNR on why the DNR should be at the coalition table. The presenter shared alarming information about trends they are seeing with alcohol use and ATV/UTV operators, including underage individuals operating while intoxicated. Maureen Busalacchi, Medical College of Wisconsin and Alcohol Policy Project, shared information about the federal budget process.
- Public Health Vending Machines: Wood County vended a total of 441 resources from Public Health Vending Machines. The River Block Building machine remains the most used machine in Wood County. Top supplies vended were Naloxone, vending 88 boxes, followed by 53 wound care kits and 45 menstrual pads.
- Providers and Teens Communicating for Health (PATCH): The new PATCH Site Coordinator, Pamela Lee, completed
 the 20-hour Teen Consultant training. Additionally, five amazing teens will start offering free Teen Consulting to
 organizations in Wood County and the surrounding counties to anyone looking to have youth voices at the table.
- IMPACT Community Team Meeting: The full IMPACT community team met on August 12. A representative from the Wisconsin Wellness Council provided a mental health training session titled "Make It Okay" to the team. During the meeting, the team discussed data fact sheets and the upcoming 2025 Community Opinions Survey on Alcohol and Other Drugs. The team will meet again on November 11.
- Alcohol Workgroup: The workgroup compiled mid-year data regarding the Place of Last Drink (POLD), identifying
 locations mentioned in alcohol-related incidents as places where individuals had their last drink. This data supports the
 coalition and law enforcement in addressing over-serving and preventing harms related to excessive alcohol use.
 Members presented on the process for Wood County's Place of Last Drink at the 2025 Wisconsin Governor's
 Conference on Highway Safety. The presentation assisted other counties across the state in implementing data
 collection and developing educational and outreach strategies.
- School Orientation: IMPACT members set up booths at Nekoosa, Port Edwards, and Wisconsin Rapids High Schools. These booths offered informational materials about the IMPACT substance prevention coalition, along with data on the use of nicotine, alcohol, and THC in Wood County. Members engaged with students, parents, and teachers to share information about the IMPACT coalition, provided resources, and encouraged participation in coalition efforts.
- THC Committee: Members of the committee met with local THC retailers to gain an understanding of what materials and resources would be beneficial for retailers to prevent youth access and to comply with age restrictions on sales to individuals 21 and over. Wisconsin Rapids adopted the Wood County hemp derivative ordinance language in July of 2025, which has now been adopted by all municipalities in Wood County. This ordinance restricts the sale of hemp-derived psychoactive products to individuals 21 years of age and older, and these products cannot be sold within 750 feet of a youth gathering location. The committee has begun discussions with law enforcement about conducting compliance checks in Wood County to ensure all retailers are following the ordinance. Staff created a summary report of THC survey results for Pittsville

Transportation and Recreation

- Catch a Ride: Staff finalized Central Wisconsin Catch a Ride's Pledge Form to share out to the public and potential donors for the program and continued work with a UWSP student to collect local transportation data. Staff met with Mid-State Technical College staff to discuss potential grants and partnerships to apply for transportation projects and created a comparison chart for Catch a Ride services compared to other existing transportation in Wood County.
- River Riders Bike Share and Marshfield Area Bike Share: River Riders Bike Share hosted their annual fall community bike ride with Sheriff Becker on Wednesday, September 10 at South Wood County Park White Sands Beach Lake Wazeecha. Photo to come next month! The season continues in Marshfield and Wisconsin Rapids throughout the month of October. Planning is taking place to implement a community-wide survey at the end of the season to hear from the community about our program.

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ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH REPORT - BEN JEFFREY, R.S.

New Businesses and Consultations

A pre-licensing inspection was completed for The Market in Pittsville. A consultation was completed for a mobile food establishment in the Wisconsin Rapids area. Environmental health staff also completed Standardization with the Department of Agriculture, Trade, and Consumer Protection last month. This exercise ensures our inspections are in line with inspectors across the state of Wisconsin.

Complaint Investigations

Eight complaint investigations were completed in the month of August.

- A complaint was received regarding solid waste and tires being disposed of on a property. Environmental health staff
 were onsite and took photographs of the property from the road. No public health violations were noted, but some
 abandoned vehicles, tires, and boats were observed.
- A caller reported poor handwashing at a licensed food establishment. Environmental health staff conducted an onsite complaint inspection and reviewed proper handwashing practices.
- A complaint was received regarding cockroaches and garbage on a rental property. Environmental health staff spoke with both the tenant and landlord in this situation. Garbage has been picked up and professional pest control has been scheduled for the cockroaches.
- A caller reported an illness after eating at a licensed food establishment. Environmental health staff conducted an onsite
 complaint inspection and discussed the complaint with the operator. No ill staff were onsite, nor any other illnesses
 reported.
- A complaint was received regarding a food worker sneezing into his or her hand. Environmental health staff visited the establishment and reviewed proper handwashing practices with the manager.
- A complaint was received regarding poor living conditions inside a home. Environmental health staff conducted an onsite inspection of the property. No public health hazards were noted at the time of inspection.
- A complaint was received regarding poor bathroom conditions inside a licensed food establishment. Environmental health staff were onsite, but the bathrooms had since been cleaned. EH Staff discussed the complaint with management.
- A complaint was received regarding a lack of maintenance in a rental unit. Environmental health staff explained that it was not a public health hazard, and the tenant needs to reach out to property management.

HEALTHY SMILES FOR WOOD COUNTY REPORT - NICOLE BURLINGAME, RDH

Healthy Smiles was awarded \$31,350.00 from Wisconsin Seal-A-Smile for the 2025/2026 school year. Oral screenings and fluoride varnish for Head Start Centers will start this later this month.

PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE SUPERVISOR REPORT - ERICA SHERMAN, MSN. RN. IBCLC

Family Health/Parents as Teachers (PAT)

- PAT hosted a Splash into Summer event on August 14 in Wisconsin Rapids. PAT families gathered at the splash pad to learn about water safety and enjoy social networking with other families.
- The PAT team continues to work in partnership with Human Services to host Parent Cafes. Two cafes were hosted in August titled Backyards to Backpacks. Trained café hosts guided discussions focused on a smooth transition back to school. Both events (one in Marshfield, one in Wisconsin Rapids) were a great success with several families participating in each event.
- The PAT program is currently accepting new families. Referrals can be made at: https://form.jotform.com/wchd8911/pat-registration-form

Maternal-Child Health (MCH)

- WellTAP: The MCH team has resumed offering fee-exempt well water testing to eligible families. This program has been
 revitalized and rebranded by Wisconsin DHS as WellTAP. To qualify for WellTAP, all of the following criteria must be
 met:
 - The well serves someone who is pregnant, a child 12 or under, or a person with weakened immune system.
 - The well serves your primary residence.
 - A financial or other burden prevents you from testing on your own.
 - Qualified well users can request a sample kit, and it will be analyzed by the Wisconsin State Lab of Hygiene.
- Lactation Support: We have increased the number of hospital-grade breast pumps available through our pump rental program. Individuals needing lactation support can schedule an appointment with a certified lactation professional for services via phone or in-person (office or home). Support services include breastfeeding education and support, weight monitoring, feeding assessment, troubleshooting, resources, and assistance obtaining necessary supplies.

Communicable Disease (CD)

- We are advising residents to continue to protect themselves against mosquito bites as we have identified this year's first human case of West Nile virus in a resident of Wood County. West Nile virus activity has been detected in other parts of Wisconsin this year, including other human cases as well as mosquitoes and animals.
- Wisconsin's measles outbreak has grown to 24 cases. All 24 cases are unvaccinated. Two have been hospitalized. We have had no measles activity in Wood County thus far.

Emergency Preparedness (EP)

- The Health Department's emergency preparedness efforts have focused on strengthening our communicable disease
 response and maintaining workforce readiness this month. Planning is underway for a measles discussion-based
 exercise with public health nurses to test surveillance, case investigation, and communication protocols. All staff are also
 completing refresher training on Incident Command System certifications to ensure we remain a competent and
 coordinated response team.
- In addition, we are closely monitoring the measles outbreak in Oconto County. Lessons learned from that response; particularly in rapid case identification, vaccination outreach, and public messaging—are being reviewed and incorporated into our local plans to enhance readiness and protect the health of our community.

WOMEN, INFANTS AND CHILDREN (WIC) REPORT - CAMEN HOFER, RD, CD, IBCLC

- The Farmers Market Nutrition Program (FMNP) usually starts June 1 but was delayed until July 1 due to a decrease in program funding. WIC has issued 437 FMNP voucher packets valued at \$25 each to eligible WIC participants from July 1 through September 8 and will continue issuing through the end of September.
- WIC is partnering with MCH and Aspirus this year to help families gain additional access to farmers market produce through the Aspirus Fruit and Veggie Rx Program. We have issued 15 of these \$20 vouchers to eligible families with a determined need for additional access to local produce.
- We've had a drop in caseload over the past couple of months. There has been an increase in families that are ineligible for the WIC program due to no longer being eligible for BadgerCare and also an increase in families moving out of state and dropping off our WIC program. After discussing with our regional state WIC representative, we also discovered our Wood County WIC agency is experiencing higher categorical ineligibility meaning more children are aging out of the program compared to other WIC agencies in the state. We are actively working on reenrolling families that may have fallen off the program due to missed appointments and continuing outreach work with HMOs, schools, and health care providers.

Educational Points: Tobacco Bar Bills (July 10th, 2025)

New tobacco bar bills, Senate Bill 211 (<u>SB 211</u>) and Assembly Bill 211 (<u>AB 211</u>) were recently introduced in the WI state legislature. SB 211 was referred to the <u>Senate Committee on Government Operations</u>, <u>Labor and Economic Development and AB 211 was referred to the <u>Assembly Committee on State Affairs</u> and passed the committee on 6/25/25.</u>

This is similar to bills that were introduced last session. This law would weaken Wisconsin's Smoke-free Air Law, which has been in place since July 2010. Current law defines tobacco bars as any tavern that generates 15 percent or more of its annual gross income from cigar and/or pipe tobacco sales. Tobacco bars are currently only allowed if they existed before June 3, 2009. The proposed legislation would increase the number of places that could allow indoor smoking of cigars, brown cigarettes or pipe tobacco products by allowing any bar that meets the 15 percent sales threshold to become a tobacco bar. It prohibits retail food establishments from becoming tobacco bars.

Local municipalities do not really have the ability to keep tobacco bars out of their communities

- Cities, towns, and villages in Wisconsin will not entirely have the authority to keep tobacco bars out
 of their neighborhoods. According to Wis. Stat. § 134.65, local governments cannot deny tobacco
 retail licenses except for very narrow circumstances outlined in state law.
- This law does not require a separate license for tobacco bars, making them hard to track and the law hard to enforce. This means that it will be difficult for law enforcement to identify whether taverns meet the 15% sales threshold, enforce what products are being smoked, and ensure public health protections.
- This proposed law does not create a separate tobacco bar license. This license is the same one
 used for selling cigarettes in bars. But it doesn't clearly show which taverns are just selling
 cigarettes and which ones allow people to smoke cigars, pipe tobacco, or other products like brown
 cigarettes.
- The current smoke-free air law is straightforward and self-enforcing. The proposed bill would pose significant enforcement challenges. It allows taverns to operate as tobacco bars by simply obtaining a tobacco retailer license (the same license that gas station owners need to sell tobacco products). However, there is no mechanism to track these tobacco bars, as there is no separate tobacco bar license.
- Neither the current state law or proposed bill include any age restrictions for who can enter taverns.
 It would be up to each business whether or not people would need to be older than 21 years old to enter.

Allowing tobacco bars would create a loophole in Wisconsin's Smoke-free Air Law.

- These changes would weaken Wisconsin's current clean indoor air protections and degrade decades of progress in both reducing exposure to secondhand smoke and preventing tobacco use.
- For 15 years, Wisconsin's smoke-free air law has prohibited smoking in indoor public places and protected workers and customers. A loophole would undermine the law, create confusion, put people at risk of serious health issues, and force workers to choose between their health and a paycheck.
- Smoke from a cigarette or cigar can stay in a room for hours. Using ventilation does not get rid of secondhand smoke. This smoke can also impact neighboring businesses and buildings.
- Individuals who work at and visit Wisconsin's taverns and restaurants do so expecting a smokefree environment. If establishments become cigar bars, those employees and customers will be in a position where they must leave their employment (or, in a customer's case, stop visiting their favorite place to enjoy an Old Fashioned) to protect their health.
- This bill would weaken Wisconsin's smoke-free air law to allow cigar, brown cigarette and pipe tobacco smoking in so-called "tobacco bars." Current law defines a tobacco bar as a tavern that generates 15 percent or more of its annual gross income from the sale of cigars and pipe tobacco. While that percentage may seem significant, small taverns could pass that threshold relatively easily with the sale of just a few high-end cigars.
- Unlike Native American traditional tobacco, cigars contain the same toxic compounds and chemicals that are found in cigarette smoke. While respecting cultural traditions is important, it can't be at the expense of endangering other people's health.

Creating loopholes for indoor smoking would make the law difficult to enforce.

- Little cigars can be identical to cigarettes (some are even the same color as cigarettes), making it hard for employees and law enforcement officers to distinguish which products are being used by customers. There's no need to add this kind of confusion to what's currently a straightforward and self-enforcing law.
- Wisconsin would have to create new procedures to track the location and revenue of tobacco bars. This would be logistically difficult, expensive for taxpayers, and could create new red tape for all taverns.
- Wisconsin has not conducted compliance checks around indoor smoking in public spaces in 15 years because the law is self-enforcing and allows few exceptions for indoor smoking. The proposed change complicates the law, would require training for law enforcement, and would cost taxpayers.

Smoke-free indoor air in Wisconsin is widely supported and plays an important role in preventing tobacco use.

- Wisconsin's clean indoor air law is broadly popular, with 77.5% of Wisconsinites supporting the current law, 18.3% neither support nor oppose, and only 4.2% oppose the clean indoor air law.²
- We know there is no safe amount of secondhand smoke, and for 15 years, Wisconsin residents have enjoyed the protections of our smoke-free law.
- By chipping away at the protections provided through the smoke-free air law, we risk renormalizing smoking. Exposing our youth to a perceived "acceptable smoking culture" sends the
 wrong message and endangers the progress we've made in reducing youth tobacco use this
 last decade and a half.
- Tobacco is still the leading cause of preventable death in WI. The smoke-free air law is a critical component of the state's multi-pronged approach to reducing tobacco use and deaths due to smoking-related causes. Since 2010, adult smoking rates have dropped from 19% to 12% in 2023³. Smoking among youth has decreased significantly since the law's passage. From 2009 to 2023, the smoking rate of Wisconsin high schoolers has dropped from 17% to 3%.
- With public health funding facing cuts at the national level, it's critical to keep best practice
 health policies like the smoke-free air law in place to sustain progress made in reducing the
 impact of tobacco products on Wisconsin.

WOOD COUNTY HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT REPORT September 2025

Director Update by Brandon Vruwink

The Operations Committee has invited the Human Services Department-Community and Norwood to their September 24 meeting to review the budgets. We will plan to attend the meeting and answer the Operations Committee's questions about our 2026 budget proposal. We will keep the Health and Human Services Committee informed of the outcome of this discussion.

Recruiting and retaining licensed mental health professionals remains a concern for us. The demand for mental health providers continues to rise, while there is a shortage of licensed staff. Within our department, we are required to have licensed staff provide supervision and to sign off on notes to ensure we are eligible for reimbursement from Medicaid. Currently, we are at the minimum staffing for licensed professionals. We have staff working on completing their hours for licensure, which will assist with backup in case staff retire or move on to other opportunities. I share this with the committee, so you are aware of this challenge. Looking to the future, we have several staff members who are nearing retirement age. To address this issue, we are working on an application to become designated as a Health Professional Shortage Area. (HPSA). We have worked through this process in the past, but were denied. With the changes over the past couple of years and the loss of professionals in Wood County, we are hopeful we can become a designated area. This designation would open up the opportunity for those licensed and practicing in Wood County to be eligible for Student Loan forgiveness. Many of those new to the field are carrying large student loans. If Wood County receives the HPSA determinations, it will assist us with our recruitment and retention efforts.

We were just informed of the out-of-home care rate increases for 2026. As expected, all of the rates have increased. Treatment Level Foster Care rates increased by 8.23%, Group homes by 4.55% and Residential Care Centers by 11.13%. We anticipated rate increases when working on our 2026 budget and have accounted for the increases. However, with rates continuing to rise every year and no additional funding included in the state budget, the increases are going to be a significant challenge moving forward.

The Wisconsin Counties Association has collaborated with NACO to hold virtual meetings with members of Congress to discuss the impact SNAP changes will have on counties in Wisconsin. I was recommended to sit on this panel by Chelsea Shanks from WCA. The meeting is an opportunity to provide data to Representative Van Orden on the cost shift to counties as a result of the passage of federal legislation.

I have also been asked to serve as a panelist for a virtual Q&A session about the changes to Medicaid and SNAP and how they may affect Wisconsin residents. The program is called "Wisconsin Knowledge Boost." The session will begin with Wisconsin Medicaid Director Bill Hanna providing an overview of the changes from a state-level perspective. Then, questions will be answered by the panelists. I look forward to this opportunity to learn more and also share my knowledge from a county perspective.

As we prepared for budget, we learned that with the evolving changes to facilities, there are differing interpretations with residential and corrections placements based on how they are coded and billed throughout the state. After consulting with fiscal, we determined that Corrections will only be facilities through Department of Corrections including Lincoln Hills, Copper Lake, Mendota, and GROW Academy. Residential treatment centers will encompass the traditional residential centers around the state such as Northwest Passage, Tomorrow's Children and Lad Lake as well as 180/360 programs and the new facility in Wisconsin RISE=UP. Given this, the one youth who was previously counted in the corrections line has been moved to the residential treatment center line as they are placed at the RISE=UP facility.

Moving forward, the Secure Detention line will represent the number of youth who served time in secure detention throughout the month. Rarely, do we place youth in secure detention. It is more common for youth to be sanctioned to secure detention short-term if they are non-compliant with their court order or commit additional crimes while on juvenile supervision. In the month of July, we had four different youth serve time in secure detention for a total of 22 days. In the month of August, we had one youth serve time in secure detention for a total of five days.

Our team recognizes the costs for out of home placement, specifically restrictive placements, and the significant impact it has on the overall budget. We work diligently to prevent sending youth to restrictive placements by addressing their needs in the community and creating programs/services to prevent placement needs. As we were reviewing our internal data, we learned in 2023, the Youth Justice team had 27 youth placed in out of home care. In 2024, the Youth Justice team had 16 youth placed in out of home care. So far in 2025, we have had 11 youth placed in out of home care. As we interpret these declining numbers, we concluded that the services and work being done is having a positive impact on our youth. Unfortunately, the costs of placements have significantly increased, and it is becoming more challenging to place youth especially when they have high needs. This has resulted in the team having to place youth outside of the state in facilities that are extremely costly.

Education/Training Opportunity: On July 15, 2025, the Youth Justice team met with members from Department of Children and Families (DCF), Children's Court Improvement Program (CCIP), and our court partners for an

introductory training into Tailored Dispositional Orders project which is a research-based approach. The child protection teams went through a similar training in 2022 have been using the conditions developed through this process since implementation in 2023. The tailored conditions capture the specific behavior changes needed to ensure child and community safety, thus assisting families and youth to successfully exit the formal system. Through this project and review of the current court ordered conditions used in Wood County, the team will ensure the expectations are clearly and plainly written at a reading level that youth can understand, focus on the underlying issues, are measurable, defines behavioral and cognitive changes, and concentrates on the required changes necessary to end court ordered supervision. Specifically in youth justice, adolescent brain development research suggests tailored conditions reduce rates of incarceration for violations of conditions and reduce the length of supervision of youth. Furthermore, research indicates a combination of rewards and sanctions is best to promote success towards achieving goals, promoting incentives, and maintaining conditions that are certain, immediate, proportionate, and fair.

Personnel: We welcomed Daryl Green to the team. She is our newest child protective services ongoing case manager in our Marshfield office. We continue to actively recruit for a child protective services initial assessment worker.

Youth Diversion Update by Angela O'Day

Parent Cafés- The Wisconsin Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention Board awarded Human Services a \$30,000 supplemental primary prevention grant to bring community Parent Cafes to Wood County between 7/1/25-6/30/26. The grant is renewable for two years. Parent Cafes are based on the five protective factors that represent essential qualities and resources that families need to support the well-being of their children and deal more effectively with the challenges and stresses of life. The five protective factors are social and emotional competence of children, knowledge of parenting and child development, social connections, parental resilience, and concrete support in times of need. Parent cafes are not typical parent education. Parent cafes engage parent participants in learning about the protective factors through deep self-reflection and peer to peer learning. The grant focus is parents of children 0-5, but all Wood County parents are welcome to attend. A long-term goal of this initiative is to reduce the number of young people involved in the youth justice system. There is a strong connection between youth justice involvement and prior child welfare system experience. By providing support to caregivers in the early years, childhood trauma can be mitigated and the parent's capacity to nurture their child is increased which supports the healthy development of the child and the adolescent. The five protective factors promote modeling and teaching social-emotional skills to children, supports healthy family communication, and empowers parents to reach out for help from outside supports when it is needed.

Parent Café Host two-day training was completed in early August through Be Strong Families. Twenty participants from Human Services, the Health Department, as well as several community partners became certified hosts. Twenty-four cafes will be offered throughout Wood County between 7/1/25-6/30/26. Each café will have a unique theme and protective factor focus. The theme of our first two cafes was routine and back to school transitions. Nine participants attended in Wisconsin Rapids, and 11 participants attended in Marshfield.

Community Art Project- The youth programming teams (ADP, TPOP, 4Sight, and Youth Mentors) worked with Rise Up Central Wisconsin to install a teen focused exterior mural in Wisconsin Rapids in August. The mural is painted on the side of the Parent Engagement Center facing Wisconsin Rapids City Hall. The mural depicts a flower garden, watering can, and the Youth Mentor program tagline "Your life, your future." The image reminds community members to invest time and resources into their goals and to make time to picture a positive future for themselves. Youth completed a series of 8 workshops to brainstorm images for the mural, helped create splatter paint features for the final mural image, and supported the mural installation.



Community Resources Update by Olivia Lloyd

Transportation: In August, the Transportation program provided 696 bus rides. Of these rides, 219 were for employment, and 138 were for medical. The program also provided 88 volunteer rides. Of these, 32 were for employment, and 38 were for medical. The 85.21 application has been released and is currently in progress. The grant application is due in December.

WHEAP: Since the 2025 heating season began October 1, 2024, Wood County has provided Energy Assistance services to 2370 households. The program has also provided HVAC services to 79 households. Applications for the 2026 season are available as of September 1st.

Employment and Training Programs Update by Lacey Piekarski

On 7/30/25, the FoodShare Employment & Training (FSET) Program hosted DHS for an annual on-site visit at our Portage County FSET office. The monitoring included review of recorded customer appointments provided in advance, in-person shadowing of customer appointments with FSET case managers, and discussion with the FSET leadership team. In addition, we reviewed contractual requirements of the FSET Program, which have been met by the NorthCentral FSET Program in the following areas (05/2025 data):

- 1. Percent of FSET Customers Assigned to Education and Training Activities: 41.70% (Benchmark: 25%)
- 2. Participation Rate in the FSET Program: 67.49% (Benchmark: 40%)
- 3. Timely Contacting of Referred Customers to FSET: 100% (Benchmark: 95%)
- 4. Customers Enrolling in FSET (Enrollment to Referral) Ratio: 39.76% (Benchmark: 25%)

Best practices shared by DHS following the visit include:

"All participants are treated with dignity and respect and the participant is always the priority."

"Staff provide excellent customer service and are committed to serving members. DHS appreciates your ongoing efforts and commitment!"

We commend our NorthCentral FSET team for their continued commitment to providing opportunity to our FSET customers. Following the monitoring, DHS continues to request feedback from our FSET Program to support various state-level projects including system enhancements and marketing materials to share program information.

Edgewater Haven Update by Justin Cieslewicz

Census Update: In the month of August, we had 8 admissions and 2 readmissions. Current Memory Care census is 16 residents. Census comparison to last year:

August 2024 – 44.10 average census with 5.65 rehab

August 2025 – 45.06 average census with 9.35 rehab

Norwood Health Center Update by Marissa Kornack

The hospital unit (Admissions) received their unannounced CMS (Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services) survey the week of August 18. The last survey occurred March of 2022. I am very proud to report that we received no health citations, and just two Life Safety Code (LSC) citations. The LSC citations were related to the existing waivers we have had in place for years related to fire dampers/air plenum returns, and our elevator opening to a staircase. The cost of construction and disruption it would cause to correct these citations would be too burdensome, which is why we have requested and been granted these waivers in the past. We have requested the renewal of these waivers with the submission of our plan of correction and await a response/approval from the state and CMS.

For the congregate meal/Meals on Wheels program, we submitted our 2026 meal cost proposal to the ADRC, for which we only bid a one-year contract extension, instead of a new three-year contract. This is due to the decrease in meals in 2025 being much larger than the estimated cuts provided to us by the ADRC, which has led to increased volatility and a decrease in confidence in their projections. If our projections based on trend hold for the rest of the year, we are looking at approximately a \$100,000 reduction in revenue compared to 2025 budget, which we have had to work to offset through reducing labor and supply expenses. Additionally, due to the large volume decrease, our costs continue increasing year to year, putting the possibility of future contracts with the ADRC in jeopardy because the cost per meal could become unreasonable due to the overhead costs associated with our operation. Following the submission of our proposal, Food Services Supervisor Burt, Assistant Administrator Haanstad, and I recently met with ADRC staff Ronda James and Mike Rhea to discuss our proposal and the factors at play.

Norwood Nursing Department by Liz Masanz

For nurses, we have a 60% weekender position and one casual position vacant. We still have one agency nurse on board covering the 60% weekend position. For CNAs, we have offers out for our last two benefited positions and may only have one or two vacant casual positions available. The updating of shift differentials and the addition of the weekend differential increased our applicant traffic and our ability to fill vacant positions.

We have been working with Health Direct (contracted pharmacy) on some issues with the assigned consultant pharmacist. We are expecting a new consultant pharmacist to take over the consulting in the next month.

Admissions Unit: The average census for the month of August was 9.97 and 8.13 YTD through August. Average length of stay for August was 9.86 and 8.46 YTD. There were 27 admissions and 28 discharges, with two 30-day readmissions.

The wait is over, as we finally had our CMS hospital survey, with amazing outcomes. We received no health citations, and the surveyors were very complimentary about the unit, treatment program, documentation, and the staff. We are all very proud of the hospital staff for this accomplishment.

Long Term Care: The long- term care unit had one admission and two discharges in August, with an average census of 11.35 on Crossroads and 12.87 on Pathways, and 11.96 and 13.29 YTD respectively, all of which are above budgeted census. We have four discharges moving into the community in the coming weeks and have at least four pending referrals/admissions to the unit in the next few weeks, as well.

Melanie, new head nurse, completed her two-month MDS training with Engage Consulting, and is now completing the MDS process on her own, which is going very well.

Melanie, Megan (social services coordinator), and Liz have been working on streamlining/creating efficiencies in the EHR by adding more electronic forms/assessments and evaluating charting/assessment workflows.

Norwood Dietary Department by Larry Burt

Congregate meals for the month of August were 4,427 with revenue of \$33,320. Congregate meals year to date were 37,989 (20% decrease compared YTD to last year), with revenue of \$290,150 (17.3% decrease compared YTD to last year). Meal reductions and impact on budget continue to be monitored and managed closely.

Of the 9,389 meals decrease YTD compared to August of 2024, Marshfield site makes up 68% of the decrease at 6,430. The Marshfield site also makes up \$49,083 of the total revenue decrease. Since the closing of Cedar Rail in October of 2024, the Marshfield site located at the Senior Center, has not made up the gap in meals lost due to the closing.

Norwood Maintenance Department by Lee Ackerman

CIP Updates:

Water Pipe Replacement- The design team continues to work on the design plans for this project. A call to discuss front end specifications for the bids was held on September 3rd.

Circulating Fans- The materials for the Circulating Fan Repairs project came in higher than anticipated, leaving less funds for the installation portion of that work. Should the installation costs exceed the CIP budgeted amount, the overage will be covered out of Operations budget, which will be supplemented by approximately \$16,000 in Focus on Energy incentives this year.

I reached out to PaNyia to ask if the CIP funds that were allocated for project # 20-25-005 (Laundry Water Heater, which was removed from the 2025 CIP to be addressed in the Pipe Replacement Project in 2026) could be used towards the fan installation if those costs exceeded the allotted amount and any such overage could not be covered by Operating budget. PaNyia responded that this would be allowable. Installation is set to begin in Sept.-Oct.

Passenger Elevator Repairs- This project was completed in August. The process went very well and there were no unexpected issues to address.

Badge Readers- Maintenance staff has begun to pull wire for this project, we plan to have the installation occur in September.

Other Maintenance:

Chiller- The refrigerant leak was repaired on the chiller. We are still working on issues with the chiller not communicating with the Desigo platform; we hope to address this in the next few weeks.

Cameras on the Admissions Unit- Maintenance has most of the wire pulled for this project and we plan to have the cameras installed in September.

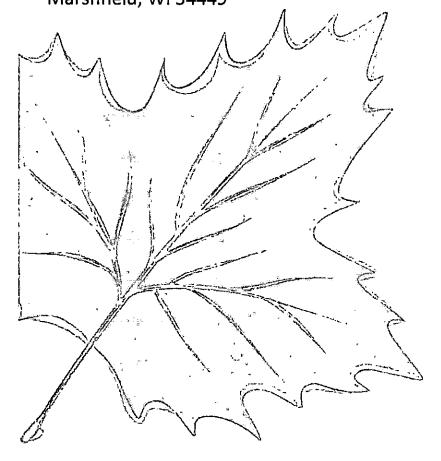

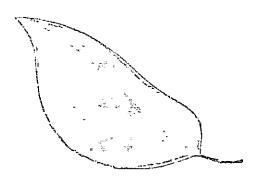

INTENT & SYNOPSIS: To request additional state funding to offset the federal funding cuts to counties for administration of the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) or Food Share in the State of Wisconsin.

FISCAL NOTE: No cost to Wood County.

WHEREAS, the federal budget reconciliation package enacted in July of 2025, makes changes to the SNAP (FoodShare) program that would reduce federal costs and significantly impact county-administered services; and

WHEREAS, these changes extend SNAP work requirements to individuals up to age 64, lower the child age threshold for parent exemptions, and eliminate waivers for areas with high unemployment, thereby increasing referrals to the FoodShare Employment and Training (FSET) program and workload for county human service departments; and

WHEREAS, the legislation requires states to contribute a minimum of 5% toward the cost of SNAP benefits if their error rate is 6% or higher, facing penalty funding of between 5% and 15% of total SNAP costs; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin's current SNAP payment error rate is 4.47%, but without additional investment in eligibility and administrative systems, heightened workloads could push the state above the 6% threshold, triggering significant penalties; and

WHEREAS, if Wisconsin's error rate reaches 6% on or after October 1, 2027, the state's 5% cost share would be approximately \$69 million annually, with potential penalty payments increasing the state's financial burden—costs that could ultimately cascade down to counties; and

Adopted by the County Board of Wood County, October 21, 2025

WHEREAS, the SNAP administrative match rate for Income Maintenance (IM) activities has been reduced from the previous 50% federal / 50% state-local to 25% federal / 75% state-local, substantially reducing federal revenue available to counties to administer SNAP; and

WHEREAS, the reduction in administrative funds could lead to a reduction in IM staff, which could result in an increased payment error rate; and

WHEREAS, county IM administrative costs are approximately \$123 million annually, with SNAP-related workload accounting for about \$49 million of those costs; and

WHEREAS, the new administrative match rate results in an estimated \$17 million annual loss in SNAP administrative funding to counties; and

WHEREAS, these federal cuts result from shifting the benefit and administrative costs to states and counties (reducing resources available for local administration), tightening work requirements (increasing county workload), and penalizing minor payment errors (resulting in more cost to the states); and

WHEREAS, counties operate under state-imposed property tax levy limits, restricting their ability to offset such funding losses without additional state or federal relief, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Wood County Board of Supervisors urges the State of Wisconsin to provide funding to offset the county fiscal impact caused by the enacted federal SNAP changes, and to work with counties to ensure adequate resources for the administration of FoodShare and related programs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Wood County Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to send a copy of this Resolution to the Governor of the State of Wisconsin, Wisconsin State Legislators with a constituency within Wood County, the Wisconsin Counties Association, and the Wisconsin County Human Service Association.
