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#### **October 2025 Activity Report**

**REPORTED TO COMMITTEE: 11/10/2025** 

#### 1. WARNING & COMMUNICATIONS

- a. On October 2, 2025, a spill of 100 gallons of wastewater occurred in Wisconsin Rapids at the ND Paper Mill. The spill occurred due to a chest overflow that and the sewer system being overwhelmed from the amount of fluid. The contaminated gravel in the area was removed along with the remaining spilled water allowing for 95 gallons to be recovered.
- b. On October 8<sup>th</sup>, 2025, a spill of Leachate occurred in the City of Wisconsin Rapids as the ADS Cranberry Creek facility. The exact amount is currently unknown. The spill was caused by the leachate trenching becoming g clogged with allowed the leachate to overflow off the line. The contaminated was dug up with an excavator and water was pumped into the leachate to clear I out.

#### 2. FUNDING

- a. Completed the EPCRA grant for FY26. We are still waiting on word if we will be getting an application for EMPG funding. This has not yet been approved by the federal administration. We currently typically receive approximately \$54,000 per year from this grant to help offset salaries and fringe benefits.
- b. Director attended the EPCRA planning grant Q&A session with the State on October 29, 2025.
- c. Deputy Director applied for the Fire House grant on October 9<sup>th</sup> for funding towards a mobile generator.

#### 3. TRAINING

- **a.** Deputy Director, Program Coordinator and Program Assistant attended Mobile Vehicle Barrier training and demonstration on October 24<sup>th</sup>.
- **b.** Deputy Director attended Local and State Mutual Aid for the Water Sector webinar on October 29<sup>th</sup>.

#### 4. Emergency Management Planning

a. Director attended the Wisconsin Emergency Management Town Hall meeting on that status of next year's grants for Emergency Management.

#### Remarks:

As you are aware, we had one of those "highly visible/low frequency" calls on the south end at the end of the month. Special thanks goes out to Wisconsin Rapids Detectives Lubeck and Bailey. From the time of the first incident, they kept me informed throughout the entire case. Deputy Coroner Kristine Huebl handled the first case, later found out to be a suicide, at Aspirus Riverview. When the second case came in the following morning, while she was off duty, she stepped up and handled that as well. We felt that if the cases were connected, we would have one investigator

handling both cases. Since everyone from Deputy Coroner Huebl to Detectives Lubeck and Bailey kept me informed every step of the way, I was able to contact Dr. Corliss and set up autopsy times for both decedents and advise him of the injuries to determine the needs at autopsy.

Chief Deputy Coroner Mark Meyers and myself will be enrolling in an online death investigation course. This will allow us to become certified ABMDI members (American Board of Medicolegal Death Investigators.) My goal is to, over time, get all of our staff trained to this level as I feel it is beneficial when we are investigating deaths that occur in Wood County.

#2 – Calls for Service: North end Wood County received a total of 60 calls for service, 3 of which were requests to respond to scene calls. South end Wood County received a total of 33 calls for service, 9 of which were requests to

respond to scene deaths. I received a total of 6 calls requesting follow-up or requesting copies of reports.

#4 – Falls: We had three fall related deaths in October. These were all elderly individuals. Most of these individuals had severe underlying health concerns but after sustaining the fall and resulting injuries, they declined rapidly. Two of these falls resulted in hip or femur fractures. The third developed a significant head injury that resulted in his passing.

#8 – Suicides: We had 1 confirmed suicide last month. While initially thought to be a homicide and associated with the homicide case, this was found to be not related to and confirmed suicide at autopsy.

#9 – Homicides: We had 1 confirmed homicide via gunshot and an edged weapon.

#### TRAINING (MONTHLY) -

Wood County K9 teams attended Wisconsin Law Enforcement Canine Handlers Association annual working conference October 5-8 located in Eau Claire, Wisconsin. This conference consists of four days of working various different sites consisting of patrol work, narcotic detection, and K9 healthcare.

#### TRAINING (INDIVIDUAL) -

- Deputy Beathard and K9 Rosco completed obedience training and narcotics training as well as educational pod casts.
- Lieutenant Christianson and K9 Bingo completed training on-duty consisting of tracking, odor detection, and obedience.
- Sergeant Arendt and K9 Timo completed 1.5 hour of on duty training with the Wood County SRT. During this time training focused on building searches for person with the tactical team and building searches with a drone. K9 Timo also apprehended a subject and team members practiced taking Timo off a bite without issues.

#### USEAGE -

- Deputy Beathard and K9 Rosco had 4 deployments for the month of October. 3 were traffic stops resulting in an arrest for .7 g of cocaine and one deployment for Marys Place in Marshfield.
- Lieutenant Christianson and K9 Bingo had two deployments during the month of October. First deployment was during a planned search warrant of a residence. During search, a suspicious item was located and believed to possibly be an explosive device. Bingo searched

- the residence and no change of behavior or indication observed. Item was located and proven to be non-explosive. Second deployment was assisting WRPD at possible crime scene, and attempting to locate any evidence. Search was conducted of area in question, and no indication, change of behavior or evidence located.
- Sergeant Arendt and K9 Timo had seven deployments for the month of October. Five deployments were for vehicle sniffs. Four of these deployments resulted in indications and searches. Located during these searches was suspected methamphetamine, suspected heroin, digital scales, drug paraphernalia, a large quantity of US currency, and various drug distribution evidence. K9 Timo was also utilized following for a woodland search for a subject following a planned search warrant. After utilizing drones, K9, and SRT members subject was not located. The final deployment was a building search for person. K9 Timo was utilized to search the basement of a basement for a possibly armed subject following a domestic disturbance. K9 Timo did not locate any subject, and it was later discovered that the subject escaped out of the window prior to law enforcement arrival.

Security Services October 2025 Report

For the month of October, the total number of prohibited items prevented from entering the Courthouse are:

Guns - 0 Knives - 72 O.C. - 8 Misc. Items - 11

The miscellaneous items that were located were multiple hand tools, an empty holster, six (6) pairs of scissors and a corkscrew.

Security Services screened 9,664 people entering the courthouse in October. Security had 46 security requests from different departments within the Courthouse. Security also assisted with one jury trial for the month.

Security served 13 civil process papers, fulfilled 11 warrants and handled five (5) complaints for the jail. The complaints were for inmate threats, battery to a CO, misuse of medication and a sexual assault complaint.

A member of the public had found a set of keys at the intersection of Lincoln St and the Express Way and didn't know what to do with them, so he brought them into the courthouse to give them to Security Services. I think this shows that the public is comfortable enough with us that they know where to come to talk to a deputy when they don't know what else to do.

During the Month of October, I utilize part-time employees for 30 hours to fill employee shortage hours. Several shifts ran short due to no part-time employees able to help.
