May 2026 Activity Report

REPORTED TO COMMITTEE: 6/8/2026

1. WARNING & COMMUNICATIONS

- a) On 05-01-2026 in Wisconsin Rapids a spill of 10 gallons of diesel into gravel occurred at the CN Wisconsin Rapids Depot. Absorbent pads were used to clean up the spill and the affected gravel will be removed. The exact cause of the spill is unknown currently.
Update: Insight FS was responsible for this spill. Cleaned up via excavator and site restored to extent practicable
- b) On 05-03-2026 in Marshfield it was reported to the DNR hotline that the individual residing at 10569 Macarthur Dr was injecting large amounts of manure into the field. This has caused drain lines in the field to become backed up and may be affecting a nearby NRCS wetland. Clean status unknown or not started.
Update: DNR investigated the release and determined that there was no release as photos showed clear water in ditches
- c) On 05-04-2026 in Marshfield a sewage release was reported at Oak Grove Terrace. The exact amount and cause of the release is unknown but a nearby stream is suspected to be impacted. Clean up status is currently unknown.
Update: Unknown amount of septage released from a failing septic system servicing a mobile home park. Cleanup completed by RP including deployment of lime and scraping impacted surfaces. Repairs completed and with no waterways affected
- d) On 05-04-2026 at the ND Paper Mill in Wisconsin Rapids a spill of 1000 gallons of paper pulp occurred due to equipment failure. A line had become plugged which then caused the pulp water to back up and overflow in the gravel drive. The spill was contained to the gravel drive area with no other areas being affected. A vacuum truck and an end loader were use to remove the affected gravel.
- e) On 05-06-2026 in the City of Nekoosa at the Moccasin Creek barrel containing an unknown substance was reportedly found partially buried in the creek. It is currently unknown how long the barrel has been there or how long it has been leaking or what the substance is. Clean up status unknown at this time.
Update: Drum was deemed unrecoverable. Closed as a complaint
- f) On 5-14-2026 in the City of Nekoosa on Hwy 73 S a release of 20 gallons of diesel was reported. The cause of the release is due to equipment failure on a fueling truck with the fuel being released on the asphalt and soil. The release was secured and clean up completed.

- g) On 5-26-2026 in the Village of Port Edwards a spill of 1 cup of hydraulic oil occurred at the Port Edwards Dam. The spill occurred from equipment failure of the damn gate mover. The gate mover was removed and placed on a concert pad to prevent further leakage into the river and for repair.

Within 10 minutes of that, we were paged to Port Edwards for a sudden death. By the time it ended, our office handled 5 sudden deaths as two more came in from Nekoosa and Wisconsin Rapids within two hours. All staff stepped up and were calling me asking what needed handling. I kept dispatch informed as to which deputy was

handling which scene. All calls, including any hospice, were handled in a timely fashion.

#2 – Calls for Service: North end Wood County received a total of 57 calls for service, 1 of which were requests to respond to scene calls. South end Wood

County received a total of 36 calls for service, 9 of which were requests to respond to scene deaths. I received a total of 11 calls requesting follow-up or requesting copies of reports.

#4 – Falls: We had 4 fall related death this past month. One of these falls resulted in severe closed head trauma, two resulted in hip fractures and ultimately resulted in “failure to thrive” conditions. The fourth fall, the individual was down on the floor too long and developed a condition known as Rhabdomyolysis. This condition leads to severe tissue breakdown, which developed into sepsis. Again, these falls were all in our elderly population.

#15 – Autopsies: We had 1 autopsy performed at UW Madison in May and are awaiting toxicology results.
